This is the time of year to start educating seniors about what we do, and how we depend on their support. Our bad news continues as Senior Senator Roberta Marti is resigning from CSL effective February 1, 2009. She has been a member of the CSL since 2002 and was a Joint Rules Committee (JRC) member representing the Housing and Transportation Policy Committee with Senior Senator Bud Winslow as her alternate. Unfortunately, Senior Senator Winslow has informed me that he is in poor health and unable to assume JRC membership. He has been a member 1992. Both of these since members will be missed. JRC representatives from that policy committee will be announced soon.

I would like to remind you that when the JRC meets we are representing the entire membership. We are restricted by the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act of 2004 as to what actions we can take. We cannot take action on items that are not on the agenda, and the agenda must be posted 10 days prior to the meeting. Also, the items on the agenda must explain enough about the subject that the public will be able to make choices as to attend the meeting or not. If any member has something that they feel the JRC should be discussing, or acting upon, please let me know at least 12 days prior to the next meeting. I will see to it that it is placed on the agenda in time. Our next meeting will be April 7 and 8, 2009.

I also wanted to remind everyone that when you submit a travel expense claim, at least 30 to 45 days is the expected wait time to receive your reimbursement.

Congratulations to all of you for your hard work on our proposals. January's Legislative visits by the Legislative Committee and JRC were well received and highly successful. We currently have seven proposals authored with possibly three to four more. It looks like it will be another successful year for the CSL. Check out the authored bills on page 3 of this publication.

New Law Authorizes Veterans' Salutes during National Anthem

WASHINGTON – Veterans and active-duty military not in uniform can now render the military-style hand salute during the playing of the national anthem, thanks to changes in federal law that took effect this month. "The military salute is a unique gesture of respect that marks those who have served in our nation's armed forces," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Dr. James B. Peake. "This provision allows the application of that honor in all events involving our nation's flag."

The new provision improves upon a little known change in federal law last year that authorized veterans to render the military-style hand salute during the raising, lowering or passing of the flag, but it did not address salutes during the national anthem. Last year's provision also applied to members of the armed forces while not in uniform.

Traditionally, members of the nation's veterans' service organizations have rendered the hand-salute during the national anthem and at events involving the national flag while wearing their organization's official head-gear.

The most recent change, authorizing hand-salutes during the national anthem by veterans and out-ofuniform military personnel, was sponsored by Sen. Jim Inhofe of Oklahoma, an Army veteran. It was included in the Defense Authorization Act of 2009, which President Bush signed on October 14, 2008.

The earlier provision authorizing hand-salutes for veterans and out-of-uniform military personnel during the raising, lowering or passing of the flag was contained in the National Defense Authorization Act of 2008, which took effect January 28, 2008.

Respiration is composed of two acts – first inspiration and then expectoration.
