This has been a very busy time for the CSL. The Leg Committee walking the halls in Sacramento, testifying for our proposals, and writing letters of support, has kept everyone busy. Our April Joint Rules Committee meeting in Sacramento was very productive. The Legislative Committee has done a fantastic job in working with legislative members this year. The great rapport with our legislators is evident by the proposals that have been picked up by legislative members this year.

Our Code 402 check-off California is a little below last year so we need to continue to work on this item. At the end of March, we had \$104,311 donated. We need \$250,000 and I hope we can reach this with the April and May donations. We need to work on the late filers now so that we can amount. reach our required REMEMBER, we must \$250,000 from the check-off campaign to remain on the State Income Tax form.

By now every PSA should have conducted their elections for Senior Senators and Senior Assembly Members. Congratulations to those who have been re-elected and to those who have been elected to serve their first four-year term. I was reminded by our parliamentarian that new CSL

members do not officially assume their duties until after being administered the oath of office at the October CSL session which is held in Sacramento.

Thank you to CSL members who have submitted Legislative proposals by the May 1, 2010 deadline. If you did not get your proposal in by the May 1st deadline, keep working on the proposal and submit it next year. If you are re-submitting a proposal you should contact the original author(s) of the proposal to gain their support; you might even ask them to be co-authors of the resubmitted proposal.

The next Joint Rules Committee meeting of the CSL will be June 14 and 15 at the Vagabond Inn, Sacramento. If you have a concern or have been thinking about an item that should be placed on the June JRC agenda, please email me at eranumone@aol.com. Two items that will be of interest to all CSL members will be the proposed CSL Budget for 2011-12 and the placement of one or more interns with CSL in the near future.
