AB 1855	Frazier	<b>Residential Care Facilities for the Elderly: Emergency and Disaster Plan</b> This bill requires by July 1, 2022 development and implementation of secure online emergency management database with an emergency disaster technology tool to be maintained and accessible by the emergency response personnel. Additionally, residential care facilities for the elderly would be required to upload their emergency and disaster plans to be the database by July 1, 2023. <b>AB 2739</b>	<b>Weber</b>	<b>Medi-Cal: monthly maintenance amount: personal and incidental needs</b> This bill would increase the monthly maintenance amount for personal and incidental needs from \$35 to \$80, and would require the department to annually adjust that amount by the same percentage as the Consumer Price Index.	<b>Wilder</b>	<b>2/21/20 In Assembly</b> From printer. May be heard in committee March 22.
<b>AB 3110</b>	<b>Jones-Sawyer</b>	<b>Working group: cognitively impaired individuals</b> This bill would express the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation that would establish a working group to develop strategies for preventing cognitively impaired individuals from going missing and locating cognitively impaired individuals who have gone missing	<b>Fried</b>	<b>2/24/20 In Assembly</b> Read first time. May be heard in Committee March 23.

Eliminate the assets test entirely for the Medicare Savings Programs, programs where Medi-Cal pays for an individual's Medicare premiums and co-payments	<b>1/30/20 In Senate.</b> Read first time. <b>AB 1962</b>	<b>Voepel</b>	<b>Sales and use taxes: exemption: senior housing.</b> Would amend the Sales and Use Tax Law, by exempting from sales and use tax, the sale of, or the storage, use, or consumption of, building materials and supplies purchased by a qualified person in the construction of specified senior housing.	<b>1/30/20 In Assembly</b> Referred to Com. on REV. & TAX. Hearing 3/9/2020.
<b>AB 2047</b>	<b>Aguiar-Curry and Limón</b>	<b>Alzheimer's disease diagnosis and treatment: train-the-trainer toolkit.</b> Directs the Consortium of ten California Alzheimer's Disease Centers (CACDs) to develop and implement a "train the trainer" model to disseminate the existing Assessment of Cognitive Complaints toolkit for Alzheimer's and Dementia (ACCT-AD) directly to physicians. By doing this, AB 2047 will increase providers' ability to provide individuals with an accurate and timely diagnosis.	<b>2/14/20 In Assembly</b> Referred to Com. on HEALTH. Hearing 3/17/2020.

<b>SB 29</b>	<b>Durazo</b>	<b>Medi-Cal: eligibility.</b> Ensures that all Californians who qualify for publicly funded Medi-Cal have access to quality care regardless of immigration status.	<b>9/4/19 In Senate</b> Read second time. Ordered to third reading
<b>SB 596</b>	<b>Stern</b>	<b>In-home supportive services: additional higher energy allowance.</b> Promotes the medical baseline program to IHSS applicants. By sharing this information, IHSS applicants who depend on a medical device can apply for and receive additional benefits that can help them be informed and plan for Safety Power Shutoffs events in the future.	<b>1/30/20 In Assembly.</b> Read first time. Held at Desk.
<b>SB 753</b>	<b>Stern</b>	<b>Public social services: emergency notification.</b> ( This bill would add telephone numbers and email addresses to the information permitted to be shared, ensure that any disabled people receiving services are included rather than only “clients” and add PSPS events to the list of enumerated emergencies where the information may be shared.	<b>1/27/20 In Assembly.</b> Read first time. Held at Desk
